

SELECTING YOUR PROGRAM

Part 3 of this Handbook is a formal record of the undergraduate teaching program of the University for 2005. The first section, the Schedule of Programs of Study, lists the programs which satisfy the requirements for the various undergraduate awards offered by Macquarie University. It is followed by the Schedule of Units and the Unit Descriptions: together they identify the units of study which are specified within those programs.

No matter which degree you are enrolled for, the Schedule of Programs of Study is the starting point when choosing an appropriate program. The following pages of advice will provide a useful guide to that Schedule.

Your Field of Interest

The programs of study in the Schedule are alphabetically arranged according to broad Areas of Study. Some general entries (such as **Arts**, **Commerce** and **Science**) have been included to help you find particular fields of interest. Each Area of Study entry lists the programs that are available for the degrees that you can complete in that area.

Coherent Studies and Study Patterns

There are two types of Programs of Study available at undergraduate level and both are listed in the Schedule:

1. A coherent study represents a particular stream of study, and consists of a specific set of units you have to complete at 300 level or higher (generally speaking, in your final year). It will have to be preceded by other units at 100 level and 200 level, but these are generally not listed as part of the coherent study – they are either prerequisites for your 300-level units or part of the general requirements for your degree, given in Part 2 of this Handbook in the section entitled General Requirements for Bachelor Degree Awards. A small number of coherent studies have some prescribed units also listed.
2. A study pattern represents a major, which is structured sequence of core units. Some majors are represented by only one study pattern, others by several. Study patterns are not intended to prescribe every unit that is to be taken in a degree, but unlike coherent studies they do include units below 300 level. As with coherent studies, you will need to ensure that you choose any remaining (elective) units so as to satisfy the general degree requirements.

Terms used

Coherent Study: is a set of units above 200 level which is approved by the University as one of the key requirements for a degree. You must select a program for your degree which has either a major or a coherent study.

Core units: are units which you must enrol in for a particular major, as they are an essential part of its structure. In some cases, these must be chosen from a set of units.

Elective units: are units which you may enrol in, if you have the appropriate prerequisites.

Major: is a sequence of units which is approved by the University as an appropriate program in a particular subject. Each major consists of a substantial number of credit points (at least 26) in core units.

Study Pattern: is a particular representation of a major. It consists of core units at each level and usually a number of elective units to make up the total credit points needed for the degree.

Program entry and transfers

Students who enrolled in the University before 2004 may continue and complete requirements for their degree under arrangements which applied at the time of their pre-2004 enrolment. The programs detailed in the Schedule of Programs of Study apply to all students enrolling in new programs in 2005.

You should note that there is a restriction on entry to some degree programs (for example, Bachelor of Laws; Bachelor of Commerce – Accounting, Bachelor of Medical Sciences). You may only enrol in a program to which the University has granted you admission; academic advisers will be able to tell you what you will need for possible transfer to other degree programs.

Selecting your Program of Study

- Be prepared to browse the Areas of Study in the Schedule, and do not be tempted to commit yourself too quickly. Academic advisers are available to direct you to suitable programs which are of interest to you and which you are eligible to enter.
- Once you have found an Area of Study which has programs that you may be interested in doing, you will need to:
 1. Check that there are degrees awarded within that Area of Study for which you are eligible to enrol
 2. Find either a coherent study or a study pattern for your degree which you would like to complete
 3. Check with an adviser to confirm that you have not missed any obvious alternatives elsewhere in the Schedule of Programs of Study
 4. Refer to the Schedule of Units
 5. If you have chosen a coherent study, select 100-level units that will form the basis of your coherent study — that is, find the prerequisites needed to enable you to enrol in your preferred 300-level units
 6. If you have selected a study pattern, choose any electives you have room for.

In choosing elective units for this and future years, make sure that you satisfy the general requirements for your degree.

Four-step process

The table on the following pages is designed to assist you with the task of selecting an appropriate program. The following four-step process will help you find the available programs in the degree you are enrolling for.

1. In Column A, locate the degree that you are enrolling for. The programs are grouped into:
 - single degrees,
 - combined law degrees,
 - double degrees, and
 - direct entry programs.

Some direct-entry programs such as Graduate Diplomas and Certificates, and the Diploma and Advanced Diploma in Community Management have not been included in this guide.

2. Using the information in Column B, ensure that you have found the particular award for which you were sent an offer (identified by the University Admissions Centre code and the title of the award as it appears in the UAC 2005 Guide). UAC preference codes for distance education enrolment in the Bachelor of Arts (300107), the Bachelor of Science (300525) and the Bachelor of Education (ECE) (300415) are indicated in this table but are not explicitly recorded in the Schedule of Programs of Study. Many programs of study are available for distance learning, but availability of individual units will need to be ascertained before enrolment.
3. From Column C, select a subject area within your chosen degree which looks attractive to you.
4. Column D lists the codes for the coherent studies and majors which are available for that subject area.
